- Website structure (navigation)
- Page layout
- Content
- Interactive effects to support the purposes of a website

The Student portfolios will open in this area, but the student page will have three columns that are 25% the width of the page.

This side margin is 5% of the width of the page

This Navigation bar is 15% of the page width. It holds the links to the student portfolios and the resource links. It is fixed to the left side of the page

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There are four containers here. The top container is 75% of the width of the page and extends down starting at 26% for another 25%. At the 50%, three column each 25% wide will contain the various pieces of student information. The Student portfolios will open in this area, but the student page will have three columns that are 25% the width of the page.
